

- n. First Aid Skills: Bandaging, Splinting, Moving, and Rescuing.

 - · Color Slide Presentation-(1) Wounds and Injuries.

Critiques	Students read articles relevant to CPR and First Aid and write a summary critique of what they learned.	Out of Class Only
