a.nbsp;nbsp; Rhythmic notation for syncopation and sixteenth notes

b.nbsp;nbsp; All the natural pitches in first position with key signatures using three sharps and three flats

c.nbsp;nbsp;nbsp; History of the modern guitar and its players from 1920 to today

d.nbsp;nbsp;nbsp; Scale and chord theory. Major pentatonic, extended minor pentatonic, and dorian

#### **Course Objectives**

	Objectives
Objective 1	Demonstrate the ability to read and perform music from various musical periods and styles with a focus on jazz, rock, and other contemporary styles in the first and second positions of the guitar.
Objective 2	Demonstrate an understanding of the pitch layout of the entire guitar.
Objective 3	Demonstrate an understanding of music technology relevant to the guitar.
Objective 4	Demonstrate the ability to play all major and minor (vertical and horizontal) pentatonic, major, and Dorian scales.
Objective 5	Demonstrate the ability to perform open position chords (C, C7, G, G7, F, D, D7, Dm, A, A7, Am, E, E7, Em, and B7) power chords, and E and A form major and minor bar chords using various strumming patterns.
Objective 6	Demonstrate the ability to improvise using vertical and horizontal versions of the minor pentatonic scale and the Dorian scale.
Objective 7	Demonstrate an understanding of the history of the guitar from the early 20th century to today and develop the ability to relate listening to historical and cultural context, musical elements, and guitar effects and techniques.

Outcome 1	Apply proper technical skills and the reading of music notation to the performance of music in the first and second positions of the guitar.
