Objective 3	Evaluate programs that are available to address mental health issues facing vulnerable populations.
Objective 4	Discuss common attitudes and stereotypes and implicit bias about mental health as they influence the quality and delivery of care in the mental health population.
Objective 5	Apply and identify self-care health promotion strategies and illness prevention principles based on current evidence- based research for the client experiencing psychiatric disorders.



Objective 6	Explore the nursing role in health promotion and disease prevention for clients with various mental health alterations while maintaining culture sensitivity to increase plan of care for client centered care.
Objective 7	Develop strategies to overcome barriers in communication with clients experiencing mental health issues.
Objective 8	Identify safety considerations for clients experiencing psychiatric crisis
Objective 9	Explore the role of the nurse as collaborator for quality improvement and safety for psychiatric clients.
Objective 10	Discuss community resources to support safe transition and adherence to treatment plan.
Objective 11	Implement technology to enhance the psychiatric client function, independence, and safety.
