#### REFUND POLICY

Refund deadlines vary for classes during each term. To qualify for a refund, a student must officially withdraw from the class by the Refund Deadline date on page 1.

Refunds, less a \$10.00 processing fee, will be processed automatically beginning October 9th and will either be mailed to the student's address on file with Admissions and Records, or returned as a credit to the credit card from which fees were originally paid. See refund policy in the course catalog for more information. Refunds of less than \$10 will not be processed and must be requested in person from the Bursar's Office.

#### **REFUND DEADLINES:**

A community college district shall not refund any enrollment fee paid by a student for program changes made after the first two weeks of instruction for a primary term-length course, or after the 10 percent point of the length of the course for a short-term course, unless the program change is a result of action by the district to cancel or reschedule a class or to drop a student pursuant to subdivision (I) of section 55003 where the student fails to meet a prerequisite.

#### RETURNED CHECK SERVICE CHARGE

#### Enrollment Fee Deadline for Fall 2023

- Students are responsible for their tuition and fees. It is important for students to drop themselves by appropriate deadlines.
- Students registering on or after August 25 must pay enrollment fees prior to the last day to drop a course.
   A financial hold will be placed on all student records that have an outstanding balance for the term that will prevent subsequent registration until paid.
- Drops for non-payment will not be processed once courses begin. Drops for non-payment will not be processed once term begins.
- Students enrolled in courses they do not attend are responsible for enrollment fees and final grades if not dropped by the applicable course deadline. Students that have been awarded financial aid will not be dropped for non-payment.
- Petitions to drop past the deadline, or for refunds of courses not dropped by the deadline, will not be accepted if student fails to drop a course by the deadline.

#### **PAYMENT PLAN OPTION**

#### The following terms are used throughout this Schedule of classes.

**SECT/SYNONYM (in Web Advisor) - SECTION NUMBER**: Every class is identified by a 4-digit section number. This number is critical to correctly register in the section you have selected.

**COURSE - COURSE CODE** - The course code identifies the department and course level.

**TITLE - COURSE TITLE -** The course title is the descriptive name of the course.

**U** - **UNITS** - This is the number of credit units that will be earned by successfully completing the course.

**SHORT-TERM CLASSES** - Short-term classes are noted throughout the schedule with starting (First Meeting:) and ending dates (Last Meeting:) listed under the class title in **bold print**. Registration deadline dates for these classes will differ from the published deadlines for full-term classes.

CROSS-LISTED or EQUIVALENT SECTIONS - One or more like courses scheduled at the same time. Enrollments of all cross-listed courses are considered by the registration system, possibly showing "course is filled" when it seems there are available seats.

**CLASS SECTIONS IN BOLD PRINT** - Evening classes, beginning at 4:00 p.m. or later, are indicated in **bold print**.

**TBA TIME** - If hours are shown as 2.3 HOURS TBA, then 2 hours and 5 minutes weekly are required (usually lab) and are TO BE ARRANGED by the student during the time the appropriate lab facility is open.



#### Assembly Bill (AB) 705


The State of California has enacted a new law affecting community college students. Assembly Bill 705 requires colleges to maximize the probability that students will complete transfer-level English and math within one year. The assessment test for English and math will no longer be administered and all students can now directly enroll in transfer-level English and math courses.

We recommend that you speak with a counselor before registration. Counselors can provide a multiple measures review of your preparation for transfer-level work. Counselors can also inform you about the particular courses that are required to meet your goal. Below is a description of the math courses and math sequences offered at College of the Desert.



#### Student Registration is Changing

College of the Desert is transitioning from WebAdvisor to Self-Service for online student access. **Beginning Summer 2023**, students will use Self-Service to add/drop courses, add themselves to waitlists, and utilize the add authorization process to enroll in closed courses. Important information on Self-Service has been placed in the student portal.

Students will still register according to their registration priority in the student planning area of Self-Service. An instructional video can be found on the student portal.

Using the waitlist feature allows students to be automatically enrolled if an open seat becomes available and the student meets all registration requirements. Students will be able to add themselves to a waitlist for courses that they are not already enrolled in. For example, if you would like to waitlist for a course, you cannot be enrolled in a different section of that course.

Add Codes were previously used via WebAdvisor to enroll in courses that are at capacity or when the course session has already started. The add code process is being replaced with Add Authorization via Self-Service to add a course during the *Add Authorization period*.

In Self-Service, once the student receives instructor approval to add a course the authorized section will have a blue "Authorized for Add" flag on their schedule. When a student receives instructor approval via Self-Service to add a course, the student will need to click the Register button to finish registering. Registration will process assuming all prerequisites and holds have been cleared.

Also, students should make sure to drop a course they have decided not to attend. Faculty are no longer required to drop during the semester. Not dropping a course will result in an FW grade.

#### What Is Work Experience?

A course that allows students to apply their education to the real world. Students create and accomplish three measurable learning objectives that are new and/or expanded responsibilities at their workplace. This ultimately empowers students to become better employees, work on new projects, add to their resume, and enhance their job skills. All students who currently work, volunteer, intern, or that have a student worker or federal work-study position are eligible. Units earned are transferrable to the CSU system and the class fits easily into the student's work and school schedule. Students may enroll in General Work Experience or an Occupational course

#### General Work Experience (WEG-095A)

Students may enroll in **General Work Experience (WEG – 095A)** if the student's current position **does not** relate to their occupational/educational goal. Students can earn **1 - 6 units** of General Work Experience per semester (if hour requirement is met, see below). All General sections will be listed under Work Experience.

#### Occupational Work Experience (XXX-095A)

Students may enroll in an Occupational course if their current position **does** relate to their educational/occupational goal. Occupational courses vary depending on student's major and are listed under the corresponding academic program as (XXX – 095A), i.e. CIS-095A, BUMA-095A, FIRE-095A, etc. Students may earn **1 - 8 units** in any occupational work experience course (if hour requirement is met, see below). Additional occupational courses may be available if not listed on Self Service.

**Note to Students:** Use the chart below to help you pre-determine up to how many units you may qualify to earn based on the number of hours you will complete. You must **manually** enter the number of units via Self Service if you are enrolling in more than one (1) unit (see image on next page). There are no exceptions to the minimum hour requirements for paid or unpaid positions.



For instance, Forensic Accountants merge accounting with investigative legal work, Public Accountants are tasked with accounting, auditing, taxes, and consulting for both business and individuals, Management Accountants provide financial information to decision makers within a company, and Non-Profit/Government Accountants are employed by various public agencies to administer and maintain their financial records.

At College of the Desert students interested in pursuing a career in accounting can earn a Certificate of Achievement in Accounting or an Associate of Science Degree in Accounting. Our accounting program is designed to provide students with the knowledge and skills necessary for employment or advancement in the accounting profession.

Additionally, students can earn a Bachelor's Degree without ever leaving the desert!

Just complete the transfer AA Business Degree at COD and then finish the upper division accounting program at the Palm Desert campus of CSUSB.

An Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) is an emergency responder trained to provide emergency medical care to the critically ill and injured. Depending on where they work, EMTs may be solely responsible for the treatment and transportation of their patients.

EMT 084 provides students with the medical knowledge and skills to become an EMT. Competencies are assessed regularly by student performance in the classroom, in the hands on skills lab and during the clinical and field internship.

Students successfully completing the course will be eligible to take the National Registry Emergency Medical Technician exam and become a nationally certified EMTs.

This course meets the EMT prerequisite for the Basic Firefighter Academy.






**Physics Program**
